Job purpose

Climate Action Fife encourages individuals, households, community groups and businesses to make Fife a greener and fairer place to live. We developed the Fife Community Cycling Action Plan on behalf of Fife Communities Climate Action Network. We carried out an in-depth consultation to identify how to get more people cycling for day-to-day journeys. We are now supporting communities across Fife to put the Plan into action!

We also deliver the 'Bike, Walk, Move' project, which encourages people in Kirkcaldy and nearby villages to cycle and walk more. The project gives them the resources, skills and confidence they need to cycle for everyday local journeys. It tackles the barriers that prevent people from cycling and walking by offering a programme of cycle training, led rides and walks, and volunteering opportunities. It also delivers the Kirkcaldy Cycling Festival.

Working with Cycling Scotland we support local employers and organisations to engage with the Cycling Friendly Award system and its benefits. The post-holder will receive training to become an assessor for the scheme.

You will be part of our 5-person Community Engagement Team, which includes one other Cycling Development Worker. Together you will lead our dynamic and committed group of cycling volunteers to support delivery of engagement activities. You will work with a range of stakeholders including community groups, Fife Council, transport companies and social and private landlords, as well as with individuals who live and/or work in Fife.

Together with the other Cycling Development Worker, you will coordinate a programme of events, training, led rides and bike maintenance classes, working across three cycle hubs in central Fife – Kirkcaldy, Benarty and Levenmouth. In each location, we support local people to take part and give them opportunities to become cycle volunteers.

You will also develop and deliver campaigns including a weekly 'Cycling Fridays' initiative, encouraging cyclists to use the roads safely.

Specific responsibilities

- Develop and deliver a programme of cycle training and led rides
- Recruit, train and support local cycling volunteers to lead cycle rides in their own communities
- Work with our skilled mechanics to organise cycle maintenance and Dr Bike events
- Engage with a wide range of partners, groups and organisations to promote activities to ensure cycling activities reach a more diverse audience
- Develop campaigns and outreach to attract a wide and diverse range of people, in particular groups who experience barriers to participation in walking and cycling activities

- Attend local events and groups to promote the work of the project
- Support businesses to make it easier for their staff to cycle to work, including promoting the Cycling Friendly Employer award scheme
- Develop and maintain relevant programme and project materials
- Assist with the organisation and delivery of the Kirkcaldy Cycling Festival
- Assist in the development and implementation of monitoring and evaluation systems
- Assist in the completion of programme reporting

General responsibilities

- To work as part of the Greener Kirkcaldy team to promote and encourage understanding of the climate emergency
- To promote the values of Greener Kirkcaldy when working in the local community
- To comply fully with the organisation's ethos, policies and procedures and relevant legislation
