

Guidance - Asking your local representative to take action

This guidance shares how best to ask your local representatives to come along to our People's Emergency Briefing film screening for elected members.

A brief personal email is the best. Identical emails hit spam.

First say...

In your own words, why you're concerned about what the climate and nature crisis means for the UK (perhaps because you've just seen the People's Emergency Briefing film, or are worried about particular threats to the UK, or are concerned for your and your family's future – the more personal, the better, and brief is fine).

Ask them if they would attend Greener Kirkcaldy's film screening for elected members in Fife.
